



## Our History

The parent organization of SOS Illinois started after World War II.

Due to the war, children were left without a home, without hope.

They were separated, often never seeing their siblings again; and foster care services at that point didn't offer much more than a roof over a head, but the founders of SOS Children's Villages International had a vision.

Instead of just finding a home for a child... build a home. Build villages.



## Our Model of Care in Illinois

A group of developers and architects responsible for building some of Chicago's tallest skyscrapers were familiar with the international model of foster care.

They felt that every child deserved a home.

30 years ago, a group of founding board members worked tirelessly to bring SOS Children's Villages to Illinois, and with it an innovative Village Model of Foster Care.




# Our Favorite Event

# What Motivates Our Team?


## **Our Work is Rewarding**
