


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DEAR FRIENDS a letter from our leadership

A young medical student's idea focused on not simply finding homes for children, but building Villages that offered a new kind of commitment to nurturing children in foster care within an intentional and supportive community.



Whether new to our in the care of one of our full-time, organizaion or having served with us for decades, our Foster Parents are called to our unique community.

Keeping Siblings Together

We believe in the importance of providing a sense of family. That's why we prioritize sibling bonds when placing children into our homes. Whereas three out of every four sibling groups are separated in traditional foster care, the Sibling Foster Care program at SOS Children's Villages Illinois centers on providing sibling groups the opportunity to live and grow together in the safety of a nurturing and intentional community environment. Siblings remain as a family unit professional Foster Parents and are supported by Village care staff and team members.
