At SOS Children's Villages Illinois, we build Villages that unite brothers and sisters in foster care, surround them with a community of hope, and help them grow into caring and productive adults.

For over 25 years, SOS Illinois has offered an innovative alternative to traditional foster care in emphasizing the following four components:

1. Children live together with their siblings; 2. Children receive care and support from a full-time, professionally trained Foster Parent; 3. Children grow up in a private, single-family hom; and 4. Children are supported by the Village, designed as an intentional community of care.

SOS Illinois operates as its own 501(c)3, with four sites in Illinois:

An 18-home Village in Lockport, Illinois:

A 19-home Village in the Auburn Gresham neighborhood of Chicago;

A 14-home Village in the Roosevelt Square community of Chicago; and

Casa Tepeyac, a site offering family strengthening services in the Back of the Yards neighborhood of Chicago.



accomplishments in education

Thanks to the generosity of our corporate partners, SOS Illinois offers the College Bound and Beyond Program for our youth. This program includes five core components: Academic Preparation, College Outreach, Application Support, Job Readiness, and Material/Technological Support. We prepare our children with the essential STEM curricula, support test preparation and awareness for entering college, and provide educational and training services to help our young adults enter the workforce and career world.

Catching Up with Rafael in College

In fall 2017, Rafael set out from one of our Villages to his newest adventure: college on the east coast. As a Posse Scholar. Rafael was chosen among 3,000 applicants for the prestigious scholarship opportunity. We recently caught up with Rafael to talk about his first semester in college on the east coast. "There are students here from all around the world:" Rafael told us. "students who've had access to

a substantially larger amount of resources than the average public school student like myself. Still, I am not discouraged because we are all in the same college now, which means I am capable of this. I just have to keep working hard."

When asked how the Village model prepared him for his life in college, Rafael gave a heartfelt and practical response.

I have become used to living around people that I am not related to, which is pretty much the dorm experience. I see other students here who are so homesick, and I just feel normal for the most part. The Village also provided me with paid work, which is helping me out here, as I have money to buy things I need."

We are so proud of Rafael and all of our youth and the ways that the care and love of our community extends to college and beyond.

Those are my rewards, just seeing them thriving and moving on."

The Village model helps take away the stigma and isolation of being a "foster kid" by allowing the children to live with large sibling groups and/ or become friends with


The Center will:
